A good breakfast and a theatrical guided tour to celebrate Acadian Day in Beaubassin-est

Some activities will take place on Sunday August 15 in Beaubassin-est !!! We invite you to start the Acadian Day celebrations by eating a good breakfast at the Saint-André-LeBlanc Center from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. You will even be served by the Beaubassin-est Mayor and Council members!

Only \$8 per plate including eggs, bacon, sausage, pancakes, toasts, beans and beverage. You can eat inside or opt for a take-out order. Several Public Health guidelines are always followed, such as disinfecting surfaces frequently and serving tables, but the mask is not mandatory.

During the afterrnoon, you can enjoy guided tours with traveling theater at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. in the Grand-Barachois Cemetery, one of the heritage cemeteries of South Acadia. A text by Mélanie Léger, "Les racines du cimetière", will be presented in a traveling theater with the help of 5 actors. Director Stacy Arseneault brought together Justin Gauvin, Diane Richard, Cassidy Gaudet, Joe Nadeau and Jacques André Levesque to share the story with us.

The tour talks about life during the first 50 years of the cemetery from 1800 to 1850. The characters include Thérèse Thériault, wife of Anselme Robichaud, the first family, Abbé Antoine Gagnon, the young mother who mourns the children gone, the stranger who died by accident while passing through Barachois and the raven, who lives in the cemetery today. An opportunity to bring to life characters and events from the past in an evocative place, based on the archives of the parish and local historians.
